A fair bit has changed for Albion Women across the summer ahead of the 2026/27 season.

For starters, there's a new boss at the helm, with Interim Head Coach Charlie Fripp inZ charge after Women's Manager Siobhan Hodgetts-Still began her maternity leave in July.

The 26-year-old has been assistant to Hodgetts-Still since the beginning of

2025/26, and helped guide the team to their decade-best finish in the FAWNL Northern Premier last term.

There are also plenty of new faces for Albion supporters to get to know - with the Baggies making 10 signings.

For starters, youngsters Riya Mannu and Lucy Day made their loan spells from Birmingham City permanent over the summer after successful stints in navy-blue-and-white last term.

There are also plenty of new faces In goal, Harriet Grimshaw has arrived from Stoke City with the view of providing a stern challenge to Charlotte Clarke between the sticks.

Fripp's midfield unit has also been bolstered, as Naomi Powell joins having played professionally in England, America and Scotland, while Rhianne Rush, an international with Thailand made the switch from Real Bedford to the Baggies across the summer.

Plenty of attacking force has been brought to The Hawthorns too. New No.9 Jess Collyer comes armed with a positive goalscoring return from her time at Loughborough Lightning, similarly to Tara Kirk - who regularly contributed in the penalty area for Peterborough United in the fourth-tier.

Winger Abbey Jones has plenty of experience with Durham and in the USA across her career so far, while Milly Round made her debut in the WSL with Aston Villa and now makes the cross-Midlands move to the Albion.

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Manchester United academy product Phoebe Hollin is the latest arrival after a spell in tier three with Halifax.

All in all, the Baggies are well-stocked for new options across the field, and it's set to be a positive season in the FAWNL Northern Premier.

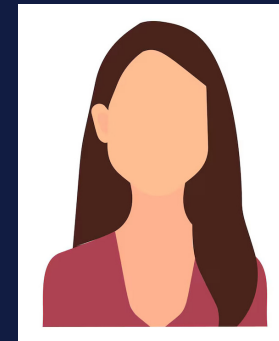

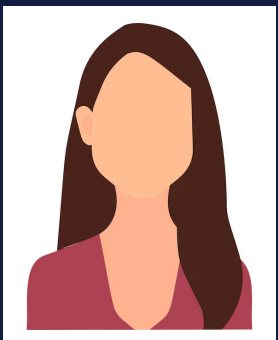
